MONDAY | 6:00 P.M. – 8:45 P.M.

BIB 102: NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY

Professor Barry Cox

An analysis of the New Testament will be discussed, surmising its purpose, theme, author and date written. Special attention is given to the synoptic gospels.

PSY 501: HEALING FOR DAMAGED EMOTIONS

Dr. Pamela Heller

This course explores emotional trauma or insecurities that are caused by an experience or event such as chronic abuse, bullying, discrimination or humiliation, guilt, anger, sadness, depression, etc. The student will study the impact of emotions and recognize when personal counseling and guidance are required.

HIS 100: HISTORY OF PENTECOST

Professor Donald Barber

A short history of the Pentecostal movement from the Apostolic to the modern era is given. The history of Pentecostal organizations and the lives of Pentecostal stalwarts are reviewed.

BIB 100B: THE PENTATEUCH

Evangelist Beatrice Guillory

This course explores the first five books of the Old Testament, Genesis through Deuteronomy. Why they were written, what they meant and how we should respond to them today will be explored. It presents an in-depth study on the structure, content, original meaning and modern application of these Mosaic writings.

CED 202: SPIRITUAL GROWTH AND MATURITY

Dr. Priscilla Brown

This course teaches self-examination fundamentals to the Christian Life's growth, development and maturity. It addresses communication and relationship with God and one's fellow man. The main focus is directed toward brokenness and God's restoration.

BIB 206: BIBLICAL SEXUAL ETHICS

Dr. Mary F. Jordan

(SEX IN THE BIBLE)- This course examines sexual practices that were accepted and not accepted in the Bible; Practices in the Old Testament versus practices in the New; as well as current-day; homosexuality, polygamy, abortion, marriage, and divorce. The text and the context in which scripture is written will be explored. This will illuminate the truth of scripture and help discern what ethics God had for his people in the past and what he has for us today.

CED 300B: SUCCESSFUL LEADERSHIP

Bishop Stephen Hamilton

This course presents a fresh and innovative look at the way church leaders lead. It addresses issues of leadership relative to the effective operation of ministry. It provides the servant-leader with appropriate situational approaches and responses with the ultimate goal being, Effectiveness.

LAN 301: BIBLICAL GREEK II

Dr. Herbert Parker

(Prerequisite Greek I, Old & New Testament)

The student will learn to apply the principles of Greek syntax to various Greek texts. Students are provided with the tools needed to analyze the syntax of the Greek New Testament. The course delves into the translation of biblical verses and applying the principles of syntax to the verses.

THE 204: HERMENEUTICS

Professor Duane Odom

This course helps the student develop the ability, through study, to gain a proper understanding of Scripture. Various principles are treated as tools for biblical understanding. Biblical characteristics are examined which enhances scriptural clarity.
